The Mississippi Forestry Commission is an equal opportunity provider.




About Us



Purpose & Implementation

The purpose of the Urban and Community Forestry (UCF) Program is to provide technical, financial, educational, and research services to communities so they can plant, protect, and maintain community trees and forests, and utilize wood from these trees, to maximize environmental, social, and economic benefits.



The Forest Service provides national UCF Program leadership and coordination.



Program delivery primarily occurs at the regional and state level, through State Forestry agencies or equivalent State agencies and other key partners.


- Twenty-three cities designated in Mississippi in 2022



- Strike teams provide tree damage and risk assessments and Federal Emergency Management Agency public assistance information to communities.





Work with municipalities in the six coastal counties to improve water quality:

- Data collection (tree canopy assessments, tree inventories)
- ✓ Increased staff capacity (hires, training for tree care professionals)
- Planning (community tree management, storm preparedness)
- Green infrastructure installation (bioswales, tree planting)

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act a.k.a.

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law

The MFC will provide a **Tree Removal and Tree Planting Grant Program** with the objective of directly aiding local urban forestry programs in the management of their green infrastructure, eliminating/suppressing invasive species, mitigating climate change, and growing resilient trees and communities.

- Emphasis will be placed on the removal of invasive plants with the potential for trees presenting risk to be considered.
- Tree planting will include native species and tree maintenance plans while promoting the inclusion of municipal personnel and community volunteers.
- Professionals such as ISA Certified Arborists and Mississippi Tree Surgeon licensed tree care companies will be required for each activity.
- Pass-through grants will be offered to Tree City USA® designated communities initially to incentivize participation in the recognition program by disengaged communities.



Additional Funding Sources

Inflation Reduction Act

in land; and (2) \$1,500,000,000 to provide multiyear, programmatic, competitive grants to a State agency, a local governmental competitive grants to a State agency, a local governmental entity, an agency or governmental entity of the District of Columbia, an agency or governmental entity of an insular area (as defined in section 1404 of the National Agricultural Research, Extension, and Teaching Policy Act of 1977 (7 U.S.C. 3103)), an Indian Tribe, or a nonprofit organization through the Urban and Community Forestry Assistance program established under section 9(c) of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978 (16 U.S.C. 2105(c)) for tree planting and related activities.


